MAHASANGRAM 2019

MahaSangram 2019: International BP Championship is the fifth edition of Debate Network Nepal's flagship debate championship that aims to provide a platform for young debaters to participate in international level debating in Nepal. The championship was coorganized by Debate Network Nepal and Xavier Academy (XA), Lazimpat, Kathmandu from July 11 to 14, 2019. This is the third time these institutions have collaborated for the same event after MahaSangram 2017. The 4 day event consisted of intensive training and debating in British Parliamentary Format of Debating.

The main objective of the event was to empower vouth and strengthen their quantitative as well qualitative presence in debate community through debate training and competition focused on different current issues and debatable topics around the world. It was yet another successful step to institutionalize debating culture in Nepal. 54 teams from all over the country had participated in the grand event in the categories of English Opens and English Novice. Each team comprised of two members and debated in British Parliamentary format in which debate lasts for an hour where four two-member teams, divided into two sides government and opposition, defend and oppose a motion or a debate topic respectively. The teams went through 5 intensive rounds of preliminaries to break into the



knockout stages. The grand finale saw Ang Sonam Sherpa and Srijan Poudel of Team Sleepless Knights as the winner in the English open category and Maheem Bista and Safal Adhikari of Team Leonardis as the Novice Champions. The best open english speaker was awarded to Farhan Rahman from Team Bangladesh and the best novice english speaker was awarded to Maheem Bista and Abhiyan Sharma. The best adjudicator was awarded to Raj Kharel. The Chair of DNN, Pawan Adhikari addressed to the participants in the closing ceremony, "MahaSangram 2019 has been the most competitive tournament of the year, both in terms of the quality of motions as well as the intensity of the ideas presented." The tournament was judged by some of the finest national and international adjudicators and was guided by a Core Adjudication Panel (CAP) consisting of Iffat Sumaya Hossain from Bangladesh, Karthik Bansal



from India, Pawan Adhikari, Alisha Bade Shrestha, Pratyush Ghimire, Pragyan Acharya, Anudit Basnet, and Manish Kadel.

MUSTANG TOUR



5 days' Mustang tour was organized from 3 -7 June 2019 as an integral part of academic calendar. At KDBC such a tour is scheduled to be organized every 3rd semester. It is a great opportunity for students to explore different parts of Nepal, experience its beauty, interact with locals and understand their cultures and lifestyles as well realizing the architectural excellence of the country. A total of 13 students from E/MBA 2018 Spring batch accompanied by the Program Officer travelled to the Mustang region from Jomsom, Muktinath to Lo Manthang. The educational tour included visits to the major places like Tatopani, Jomsom, Kagbeni, Muktinath, Dhumba and Pokhara.

The tour was beautified with everything, from the breathtaking landscapes that were so fascinating like foreign locations to roads so dangerous, giving Goose bumps. From excitement of exploring a new destination every day to fatigue caused by the nonstop jeep journey on roads having innumerable turns with several ups and downs to the happiness of finally reaching to the hotels. Despite the day-long tiring drive students explored Dhumba Lake, Jomsom Bazaar, and the age-old Trans-Himalayan Salt Trade route on the very first day and had an overnight stay overnight at Jomsom.



On the second day, early in the morning the group visited Muktinath temple one of the famous pilgrimage sites for both Hindus and Buddhists. There is a sacred pool of water in front of the temple famously known as Muktikunda. It is believed to purge people of their past sins and negativity. Another point of attraction is 108 water spouts around the temple, believed that to bath in it provide salvation after death. Thereafter, the group headed towards Lo Manthang, the walled capital of Upper Mustang considered to be one of the best-preserved examples of Tibetan culture in the world. Other attractions and sightseeing explored were Tibet border, monasteries such as Jyampa, Thubchen and Chodye, Chortens and Mani wall, the monasteries of Namgyal, Loghekar, Charang, Ghami and Ghiling, the palaces of Lomanthang and Charang, the Chungsi, Gonga Gang and Luri caves, the 305-metre long Mani wall and Khorokchortens in Ghami, and the group of Chortens in Tangya presents tangibly outstanding monuments of Upper Mustang followed by Tatopani and Pokhara.

From the MBA student's perspective, Mustang region has great market potentiality in terms of both internal and external tourists. With the trend of Nepalese wanting to travel more than stay in their houses Mustang is a treasure that has so much to offer in



terms of its beauty and adventure. Tourism is one of the major sources of their livelihood along with trade and animal husbandry but the true potential of the place is still not utilized. Tourism itself can bring ample amount of revenue to all the communities which can guarantee that they won't have to migrate to other places for opportunities. The people in these regions have better command of the English language than even most of the people of the urban areas. Their understanding and value that they give to education is commendable. But there are still some areas that need to be reformed, for examples: there are not enough hospitals, the roads are dangerous and tele-communication is difficult. There are some concerns as well as some aspects which can be improved.

Just in five days, students learnt about the way people live in the Himalayas and the differences in cultural and geographic settings. Students got many ideas about the local businesses as well such as vegetable farming, cattle farming, education, and local tourism and entrepreneurship opportunities in the region. Students found the tour very instructive, informative and full of fun.
